

KS2 Homework Project Autumn 2024

This term we have been learning about Crewkerne as a community and comparing it with another community in the South west. We will also be completing a fieldwork enquiry, investigating an issue within Crewkerne. As part of forest school we have been learning to read maps, identify symbols and keys and use grid references.



Your homework project challenge this term, is to **choose one of the options** below and explore the area that interests you in more detail.

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| <p>Make a map of The South-West of England:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Add symbols and pictures to the map to show important features. • Create a key showing what the symbols represent. | <p>Make a map of your house and garden:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include symbols to represent areas on your map. • Create a key for the symbols you have included. |
| <p>Make a settlement and land-use map of a locality in the South-West:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Print or draw a map of the locality you have chosen. • Annotate the map with reasons for why you think the settlement was created. E.g. water nearby, flat land, fertile land. • On a second map, or using tracing paper, identify the land use of your chosen locality. This could be residential areas (homes), commercial (shops) and industrial (factories) | <p>Make a tourist brochure for a locality in the South-West:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Choose a locality that you know well and would recommend visiting. • Make a tourist brochure or information leaflet about your chosen locality. What places should a person coming to the area visit? |
| <p>Sustainability – investigate a local environmental issue and write a newsreport about it:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Pick an important local issue linked to the environment and research the issue. How is this issue causing a problem? What suggestions could you make for solving this problem? • Write a newspaper article about the issue and suggest ways to resolve the problems. | <p>Go for a walk and make a map of your walk:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a map of your walk with the things you can see – it could be an aerial map or oblique angle view map. • Include on your map: OS symbols and a key to explain what these symbols represent. |

You will be sharing your map, newsreport or brochure with your class. Be prepared to talk about what you did and be ready to answer any questions!

Your chosen project needs to be in school by **Monday 18th November**. We look forward to seeing your projects.
