Basic first aid

Using the *First Aid Champions* resources within your SCARF plans

These resources are flexible, leaving you free to decide where best to place this topic within your PSHE Education programme. We've added them to the suggested half-termly units as a starting point for you, but you may wish to have a special basic first aid day or week at your school, when all classes learn these important skills together.

Please note: schools aren't expected to cover all of the DfE's 67 end-of-primary school RSHE statements in every year group. Schools are free to decide the best years and times to cover each one. We've included the link to these Basic First Aid plans across different half-termly units because there's no right or wrong fit for them; a key objective here was not to overload any of

the six half-termly units for each group. If your school prefers to cover this topic with every year group and at the same time, you can use our [Flexible Planning Tool](#) to re-organise your SCARF lesson plans for this purpose, or record this change in a way that matches your existing record-keeping methods.

The site contains two introductory lessons:

1. Why is first aid important
2. Giving first aid

There are then a further eight lessons with specific first aid skills for children to learn and practise:

- Asthma attack
- Bleeding
- Broken bone
- Burns
- Choking
- Head injury
- Unresponsive and breathing
- Unresponsive and not breathing

Learning outcomes are included, along with resources needed.

- *Simple actions can make a difference.*
- *Anyone can learn to give first aid in different situations.*
- *First Aid Champions lessons enable children to feel confident that they can help.*
- *If children are confident, they will be inspired to help.*

People have accidents or are suddenly taken ill every day of the year. By learning first aid, children are empowered to look after themselves and each other.

First aid is an invaluable life skill that also helps meet whole school outcomes – particularly in SMSC (England), Curriculum for Excellence (Scotland), PSE (Wales) and Learning for Life & Work (Northern Ireland).

First Aid Champions equips you with everything you need to teach primary school pupils the essentials of first aid. It is simple to use and requires no specialist knowledge of first aid.
